Re: Service Dogs in and around Cheyenne Mountain Zoo

Cheyenne Mountain Zoo abides by the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) and wants to insure every guest enjoys the Zoo. It is important to remember that the Department of Justice guidelines allow us to refuse admittance of service animals if they pose a real threat to the safe operation of our Zoo. Pets are not to travel inside a vehicle through the Zoo to the Will Rogers Shrine.

Service dogs are allowed in the following areas of the Zoo:

Main Road to Okapi, Tapirs and Elephants

Australia: ONLY in the winter when wallabies are inside their enclosure.

Asian Highlands: Amur Leopards, Pallas Cats and Amur Tigers.

Rocky Mountain Wild: Grizzly Bears, Otters then to the Lynx. You may view the Mountain Lions from the Lynx then back track to the road. Follow that down past the Big Back Yard. Big Back Yard is off limits.

Service dogs are NOT allowed in the following areas of the Zoo:

African Rift Valley

Budgie Buddy Birds

Wallabies when they are out in the open yard.

Big Back Yard

Moose Area

Monkey Pavilion

Cheyenne Mountain Zoo is not required by law to allow service animal training within the Zoo.
