WWF-Malaysia Releases Reports on the Comparison Between RSPO and MSPO Certification Schemes

Kuala Lumpur: The Malaysian palm oil industry is well on the road to sustainability but a lot more can be done to improve it. Sustainable palm oil is important because it fulfills increasing global food demand, supports affordable food prices and poverty reduction. Likewise, it safeguards communities and workers' social interests as well as protects the environment and wildlife.

In recent years, demand for certified sustainable palm oil (CSPO) by markets in developed countries, specifically from the European Union (EU), has seen an upward trend. This trend is expected to expand into other big palm oil markets such as China and India. Malaysia's commitment to sustainably produced palm oil is clear via the Malaysian Sustainable Palm Oil (MSPO) certification, which will be made mandatory in 2019. ([Read the full story](#))
