## Frequently Asked Questions 2019

### • I work full time and need to drop my child off early, what are my options?

- No teen participant is allowed on grounds before 8am or after 5pm unless previously set up with Teen Program Supervisor
- o If teens are on grounds at a time that they are not scheduled, the Teen Program staff is not responsible

#### • My teenager's uniform gets dirty pretty quick, can we purchase another one?

O Yes, extra t-shirts are \$10 a piece and can be purchased with cash, check or credit card in the Education Office throughout the summer. You can always send Austin or Karyn an email and they will put one aside for you!

# • We are taking a vacation during the summer, how far in advance should we let the supervisors know?

O Please let Austin and/or the Lead Teen Mentor know as soon as possible to help us know in advance that your teen will not be on grounds for a while.

#### • Can my teen stay on Zoo grounds until the Zoo closes if their shift ends earlier?

- Yes, teens are allowed to stay on grounds as Zoo guests until 5pm, no teen is allowed on grounds after 5pm
- O Teen Program staff doesn't go home until teens go home, please make your greatest effort to be on time, Zoo staff will do the same

#### • Are EdVenture trip fees included in the program payment? When can we sign up?

- O No, because trips are limited to certain numbers of participants most trips will have an associated extra fee
- All EdVenture sign ups are open online, if you need access please contact Teen Staff members, we do NOT post these trips on the website

#### My teen isn't feeling well and can't make it to a shift, who should I call?

 We ask that you call Austin Kennedy at 719-424-7822 and leave her a voicemail. Both Austin and Karyn check that voicemail daily during the program

#### • I want to come and walk around the Zoo while my teen is working, is that okay?

O During the program dates of May 23<sup>rd</sup>-August 8<sup>th</sup> the teens family, up to three immediate family members that live in their household can come into the Zoo at no cost. The teen must be wearing their name tag to enter the Zoo with family. Please check in at the front gates before entering the Zoo.

#### • Is there a minimum number of hours my teen needs to complete over the summer?

• We like to recommend trying to complete 100-120 hours over the summer session. It is not required but we find that when you commit more time to getting to know your peers, the staff, and the animals the quality of the teens experience is higher.
