

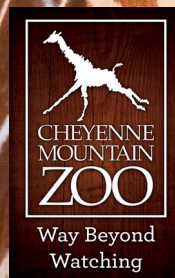


What is the International Center for the Care and Conservation of Giraffe?

Cheyenne Mountain Zoo has a long history of caring for a large herd of prolific, interactive giraffe that participate in all-day guest feedings, weekly hoof care and a wide variety of trained voluntary husbandry and medical procedures. The herd has seen over 200 giraffe calf births, and the team who cares for them is passionate about learning more, teaching more, and building a network to advance the care of these beautiful creatures. The International Center for the Care and Conservation of Giraffe is a concentrated effort by CMZoo to consolidate resources and expand educational programs in order to improve and enrich the lives of giraffe in human care throughout the world.

Our Goals

1. **Improve the quality of veterinary care** available for giraffe in human care and leverage that information for field conservation.
2. **Continue to advance behavioral husbandry practices** to improve giraffe welfare.
3. **Establish Emergency Response Teams** worldwide to respond to giraffe health emergencies and field conservation needs.

CMZoo-Hosted Workshops

GIRAFFE CARE WORKSHOP

Creating a strong community of giraffe professionals, this week-long workshop empowers attendees to continually improve giraffe welfare, in situ and ex situ. Memorable lecture material is balanced with roundtable discussions and other hands-on activities with CMZoo's herd, like practicing training techniques, watching demonstrations and creating enrichment. Attendees work through various giraffe-specific modules with CMZoo staff and gain knowledge and experience in the following topics: training, browse programs, hoof care, conservation, teamwork, roadblocks, enrichment and guest/giraffe interactions.

GIRAFFE TRAINING WORKSHOP

Participants must have attended the Giraffe Care Workshop to join this workshop. This 4-day workshop focuses specifically on the science of behavior change and how trainers can harness the environment to increase desired behaviors. In-depth training concepts learned in this workshop can be applied to improve the lives of giraffe in human care.

GIRAFFE PRIVATE OWNER WORKSHOP

Led by worldwide experts in nutrition, reproduction, hoof care and anesthesia, this 3-day workshop offers an opportunity for private owners to network and collaborate with each other, under the expert guidance of AZA-accredited leadership, to advance giraffe welfare and conservation.

GIRAFFE VETERINARY MEDICINE 101

This new course will be offered in 2023 and will provide an opportunity for veterinarians who work with giraffe to collaborate, learn and network together to improve giraffe medicine.
